Is your child happy at school?	Yes - 99%		No - 1% (2)	We are delighted that so many of our children are happy at St Basil's. We have worked with, and will continue to work with, the two parents/carers who said that their child was not happy at school.
Does the school respond well to concerns that you raise?	Yes 92%	N/A 7%	No – 1% (2)	We always endeavour to deal with any concerns and we are disappointed that not of all our parents agree with this. If parents/carers have any concerns, we ask that they speak to us so that we can resolve any issues.
Do you feel the school provides appropriate support through workshops for you to help your child's learning at home?	Yes – 99%		No – 1% (2)	We are really pleased that the majority of parents/carers agree that we have lots of workshops to support learning at home. We ask that parents/carers give feedback to suggest any future workshops that they feel would be beneficial.
Does your child enjoy reading their school reading book and read regularly at home?	Yes – 96%		No – 4% (8)	In the last year, the school has invested thousands of pounds in new reading books, which we hope will capture the children's interests in reading. We are always happy to discuss any barriers to reading at home so that we can act upon them.
Do you feel your child receives an appropriate amount of homework for their age?	Yes – 95%		No – 5% (10)	We are thankful that we have supportive parents/carers who complete homework tasks to benefit their child's learning. Last year, we identified one year group where homework tasks took longer amounts of time to complete. We have addressed this and we hope that this issue has now been resolved.
Do you feel your child has made good progress this year?	Yes – 96%	N/A 3%	No – 1% (2)	We are glad that you agree that your children are making fantastic progress and you can see this in their workbooks. We are always happy to discuss with parents/carers any concerns that they have regarding their child's progress.
Have you received helpful information about your child's progress? In the Early Years, the parents/carers are invited to half termly Inspire sessions based on Communication and Language, phonics, writing and maths.

Parents/carers are invited to look at their children's books and learning environments following class assemblies that are held each year.

After each of the above sessions, we ask for feedback to ensure that we can plan any suggestions into future workshops.

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
