

Questionnaire Results – Parent/carer Consultations Spring 2019

Following the parent/carer Consultations, we have summarised the results from the questionnaires below

Question	What you said		What we did
My child is happy at this school	Yes – 96%	No – 2% (5)	We are delighted that so many parents and carers feel that their child is happy at school. Children who are happy and feel safe are willing to take risks in their learning which helps them develop and progress.
My child is well looked after at this school	Yes – 99%	No – 0.5% (1)	We are pleased that so many parents feel that their child is well looked after at school. As a staff we are proud of the relationships we have built with our pupils and recognise the importance of these relationships in making your child feel safe and well looked after.
My child is taught well at this school	Yes – 100%	No – 0%	We are ecstatic that you recognise how hard the teachers at St Basil’s work in order to ensure that each child is taught in a way that allows them to progress and enjoy learning. Each teacher is passionate about their role and understands the important role they play in your child’s education.
I know how my child is progressing	Yes – 97.5 %	No – 0.5% (1)	It is important to us that each child’s parents/ carers knows about their progress. We have already held two parents evenings this year, and have a third planned in the Summer term. We are delighted that so many parents feel informed about how their child is progressing.
The school helps me in supporting my child with their learning	Yes - 98%	No – 0.5% (1)	We are delighted that so many parents and carers feel supported in helping their child with their learning. In this academic year, we have held parental workshops focusing on Times Tables and Reading. It is important that each child’s parents/ carers knows how to support their child with their learning and develop this learning further.
The school provides appropriate homework	Yes – 96.5%	No – 2.5% (6)	Each child receives weekly homework which is linked to learning that has taken place in class or learning that is about to happen. We have also introduced ‘Times Table Rock Stars’ which lots of

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			children are accessing and this is another way that you can support your child.
The school makes sure pupils are well behaved	Yes –88 %	No – 4% (10)	At St. Basil’s we have three simple rules for the children to follow. These very clear rules provide a consistent approach to behaviour management. We expect all children to ‘Be Respectful’, ‘Be Proud’ and ‘Be Safe’.
The school deals effectively with unacceptable behaviour	Yes – 83%	No – 4% (9)	We praise children who are making the right choices and following our three school rules. We talk to the children about how behaviour is a choice and that they are all able to make the right choice. When behaviour is unacceptable there are consequences and the children are asked to reflect on the choices they have made. This approach teaches children that they are responsible for their behaviour choices and that all choices have consequences.
The school deals effectively with bullying	Yes – 72%	No – 3% (7)	As part of our recent school development we have introduced a ‘Restorative Approach’ to getting on and falling out issues when they arise. The approach has been introduced to all adults in school and we feel that the children are responding well to the approach. It allows the children to discuss their feelings and explore ideas how situations could be handled differently next time.
Would you recommend this school to another parent?	Yes – 88%	No – 2% (4)	We are very proud of our school and the children are proud too. We are pleased that so many of you would recommend the school to family members and friends.
