Reception

The children will learn that there are special days celebrated by Jewish people, including 'Hanukkah' the feast of lights.



Year One

The children will hear special stories about Abraham and Moses – leaders of the Jewish people. They will focus on how God led the Jewish people.

Year Two

The children will learn and respect that there are special days in the Jewish religion and that Saturday is God's special day. They will hear how the family gather for 'Shabbat' and share a special meal.




Year Three

The children will find out about special places for worship in the Jewish religion. They will learn about the importance of the synagogue.




Year Four



The children will learn about the Torah; they will respect the importance of the Torah (holy book) and appreciate the guidance it provides for Jewish people.

Year Five

The children will learn and respect the different beliefs and festivals in the Jewish faith. They will understand that at the celebration of Pesach (Passover), God showed how he cared for his people and that Jewish people remember this each time they share in their special Pesach meal.



Year Six



The children will further their understanding of the belonging and values in the Jewish faith. They will learn that the celebration of Yom Kippur symbolises making a new start and that the Jewish people prepare for the opportunity to make up for the wrong that they have done.
