


St. Basil's Catholic Primary School 'Come and See' Religious Education Programme

A special **WELCOME** also to our new pupils and families joining us for the first time. This term we continue with the themes outlined in our Religious Education programme 'Come and See'. Each year group will approach the three themes through different topics which are detailed below. During the term the children will also spend a week studying the religion of Judaism and a week studying Islam.

DOMESTIC CHURCH – FAMILY TOPIC

2nd September - 1st October

Year 3	Homes - God's vision for every family
Year 4	People - The family of God in Scripture
Year 5	Ourselves - Created in the image and likeness of God
Year 6	Loving - God who never stops loving



Suggestions for home activities

Make a collage using family photographs of all the significant family members—grandparents, parents, children, aunts, uncles etc. who show God's love. Write underneath it "We show God's Love to one another." Include those who have died.

The children will study various aspects of the religion of Judaism during this week.



BAPTISM/CONFIRMATION-BELONGING THEME

11th October – 12th November

Early Years	Welcome - Baptism: a welcome to God's family
Year 1	Belonging - Baptism: an invitation to belong to God's family
Year 2	Signs and Symbols - Signs and symbols in Baptism
Year 3	Promises - Promises made at Baptism
Year 4	Called - Confirmation: a call to witness
Year 5	Life Choices - Marriage, commitment and service
Year 6	Vocation and Commitment - The vocation of priesthood and religious life

Talk to someone who has been to a Baptism and/or Confirmation about their memories of this celebration.

ADVENT / CHRISTMAS - LOVING THEME

22nd November - 21st December

Advent means 'coming'. We think of the coming of Jesus when he was born but we also think of his promise that he would come again at the end of time. It is a time of waiting and preparing. It is only in the last week of Advent that we focus upon the events to be celebrated at Christmas.

Early Years	Birthdays - Looking forward to Jesus' Birthday
Year 1	Waiting - Advent: a time to look forward to Christmas
Year 2	Preparations - Advent: preparing to celebrate Christmas
Year 3	Visitors - waiting for the coming of Jesus
Year 4	Gift - God's gift of love and friendship in Jesus
Year 5	Hope - Advent: waiting in joyful hope for Jesus, the promised one
Year 6	Expectations - Jesus born to show God to the World



Suggestions for home activities

Discuss with the children how your family welcomes visitors to your home. Find out about some Christian symbols for advent, e.g. advent wreath, or calendar. Use the CAFOD or Mission websites to get a religious Advent calendar.

Significant events in the Catholic Liturgical Calendar that we will mark in school with the children are...

CAFOD Harvest Fast Day (1st October)

All Saints and All Souls (1st and 2nd November)

We celebrate the lives of special and ordinary people who have responded to God's invitation to love. Throughout November we pray for those who have died. *Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.*

First Sunday of Advent (28th November) followed by the Season of Advent

The Feast of Saint Andrew (30th November)
