

Early Years and Year 1 : Religious Education Directory (RED)

This term our Reception and Year 1 pupils will follow themes from the newly developed RED which is being introduced in phases to Catholic schools nationally. The new curriculum is organised in half termly themes, known as branches.

Half term one: 'Galilee to Jerusalem' branch (8th January - 9th February)

In this branch, pupils will experience the ministry of Jesus, the Word of God. They will learn about the life of Jesus and his revelation of the Kingdom of God through parables, encounters, miracles, and teachings. They will learn about the call of the disciples and the nature of being a follower of Jesus.

Half term two: 'Desert to Garden' branch (19th February - 28th March)

In this branch, pupils will study the season of Lent as a time to prepare for Easter. They will know the story of the last week of Jesus' life (Holy Week), his death and resurrection. The title of this branch refers to both the journey from the desert of Lent to the garden of Resurrection, but also to the Paschal journey from darkness to light and death to life.

Years 2-6 'Come and See' Religious Education Programme

These year groups will continue with the themes outlined in our Religious Education programme 'Come and See'. Each year group will approach the three themes through different topics which are detailed below.

Unity- Eucharist enabling people to live in communion

Look through the family photograph album to help the children remember important events and special people in their lives. Discuss how we come together for special celebrations.

Suggestions for home activities

If you have an older child provide him/her with an opportunity to take part in The Stations of the Cross. Ask your child(ren) how the school is focusing on Lent and self-giving.
